The U.S. Representative presented the cultural award to Erin Cressida Wison and Sten Orting for their operatic adaptation of *The Snow Queen*.

Bo Corre and Martin Fried stepped up to receive the award for their ongoing work on the play, *The Intimate Theater*, from the VP from **Sweden**. Swedish born artist Sigrid Sandstrøm was also a winner.

Abstract artist, Marjukka Kaminen, was the Finnish choice as recipient.

Iceland's choice was Anna Palmadottir, a freelance photographer.

Andre von Morisse, Norwegian painter, living in the US, and The Norwegian Immigration Association, an exhibit in progress, garnered the award from the VP representing Norway.

Denmark's decision was to honor Sonia Jacobsen, jazz musician and Poetry/In Transit, a project for the presentation of Danish poetry, with English translation.

Anne Vilsbøll reflects uniqueness in the use of paper as an expressive medium. Her works have created a new yardstick for the possibilities of paper in art. Her luminous colors result from the application of different layers and types of paper which ultimately are vacuum-pressed on canvas--creating a stunning effect.

Steen Lundstrøm has chosen the non-figurative as his artistic measure. He works with collages, paintings and graphics. Black is dominant and is used to put the light-and more pure colors--in perspective.

The exhibit was exciting as was evidenced by the conversations overheard as viewers enjoyed refreshments provided by Carlsberg Breweries and Tholstrup Cheese, USA, Inc.

## NINA-MARGRET GRIMSDOTTIR • NINA CROTHERS • RAGIN WENK-WOLFF HIGHLIGHT AN EVENING AT STEINWAY HALL

The grand pianos of Steinway Hall, the majestic crystal chandelier hanging from the hand-painted dome and the wonderful paintings of the world's greatest composers set the stage for three of our outstanding Scandinavian performers, on October 7th. All three are former recipients of The American Scandinavian Society Cultural Awards. We have our new Program Committee Chairperson, Leena Scutt to thank for arranging the lovely evening.

Icelandic pianist, Nina-Margret Grimsdottir, presented a passionately and brilliantly executed Mendelssohn, an Icelandic dance by Sveinbjornsson, and selections from George Gershwin. The highlight of the debut and world premiere of a new piece by composer John A. Speight, For Nina-Margret, an evocative composition depicting the sounds and feelings of New York. Many of us met Mr. Speight and his wife earlier this year when they appeared at the King Olav V's Church. We were thrilled to be the first to hear this exceptionally fine composition.

Finnish-American violinist, Nina Crothers, was a most special delight, endearing us with the great depth of her mellow, deep and soulful sounds. She performed Tulindberg, the first known Finnish composer, and then six bagatelles for solo violin by Finnish composer, Mustonen. A light Finnish folk song balanced her program.

Greatly acclaimed Norwegian violinist, Ragin Wenk-Wolff, treated us with her virtuosity, dexterity and demonstrated her mastery of various techniques on the violin. She played Pugnani-Kreisler, For Ragin, by the contemporary Norwegian composer, Johan Kvandal, who is one of the most performed Scandinavian composers living today. Maurice Ravel's Tzigane, for violin and Luthreal, was featured with its gypsy flair. Steinway Hall was perfect for this rendition because it provided a rare Luthreal, an upright piano, played by Ragin's accompanist, Evan Solomon.




